The Initial Distribution of the Net Settlement Fund in this securities class action was conducted on June 12, 2025. \$70,816.80 in checks issued in the Initial Distribution remain uncashed. The stale date for the cashing of those checks was September 10, 2025. The Claims Administrator has made extensive efforts to follow up with Claimants who have not cashed their checks by automated and live telephone calls. In addition, there is approximately \$404,000 available as a result of the Reserve established in the Distribution Order (see ECF No. 151, at ¶ 3(c)).
Per the Distribution Order, the remaining balance in the Net Settlement Fund, including the Reserve and the value of the uncashed checks, and less estimated taxes and unpaid administrative fees and expenses, will be distributed in a Second Distribution to those eligible Claimants who cashed their Initial Distribution payments and who would be eligible for a \$5 payment from the remaining funds. See ECF No. 151, at ¶ 3(f).

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NOTES TO THE POST-DISTRIBUTION ACCOUNTING

Line

- 1. As of August 31, 2025, the Settlement Fund has earned a total of \$873,271.90 in interest since its inception, which has increased the total value of the Settlement Fund from the Settlement Amount of \$10,500,000 to \$11,373,271.90.
- 2,3. In a securities class action such as this one, the "number of class members" is not precisely known because the securities are widely traded and there is no definitive list of class members available to the parties covering all times during the class period. The number listed on Line 2 is the total number of Notices mailed in this matter. Notices were mailed to all potential Settlement Class Members who were identified through reasonable efforts, including through requests to brokers and nominees to identify all potential Settlement Class Members. Because the courtapproved process for disseminating notice by mail is designed to reach the maximum number of potential class members, it typically results in an overbroad dissemination of notice, including the direct mailing of notices to a substantial number of persons who are not class members, such as nominees who are not beneficial owners; persons who only held, but did not purchase, the relevant securities during the class period; or persons who purchased the securities during the class period but sold such securities before any alleged corrective disclosure and were not damaged.
- 4,5. As noted above, some recipients of the Notice may not have been members of the Settlement Class. Accordingly, the percentage in Line 5 does not necessarily reflect the percentage of Settlement Class Members who submitted Claim Forms.
 - The percentage of participating Settlement Class Members can also be represented by the percentage of damaged shares participating in the Claims process. Here, the accepted Claims include a total of 675,933,525 damaged shares, which represents approximately 86% of the total number of damaged shares as estimated by Lead Plaintiffs' damages expert.
- 18. The number provided for "Amount of settlement funds claimed by class member[s]" is the total amount distributed as set forth in Line 19, \$7,965,172.60, *less* the total amount for uncashed checks as set forth in Line 17, \$70,816.80, and *less* \$17,148.11 in funds that were returned either as undeliverable or because the claimant no longer maintained an account with the entity that filed the claim on the claimant's behalf and could not be located.
- 22. The amount provided for attorneys' fees is equal to 18% of the \$10.5 million settlement, \$1,890,000, and Court-awarded interest thereon in the amount of \$32,732.42.
